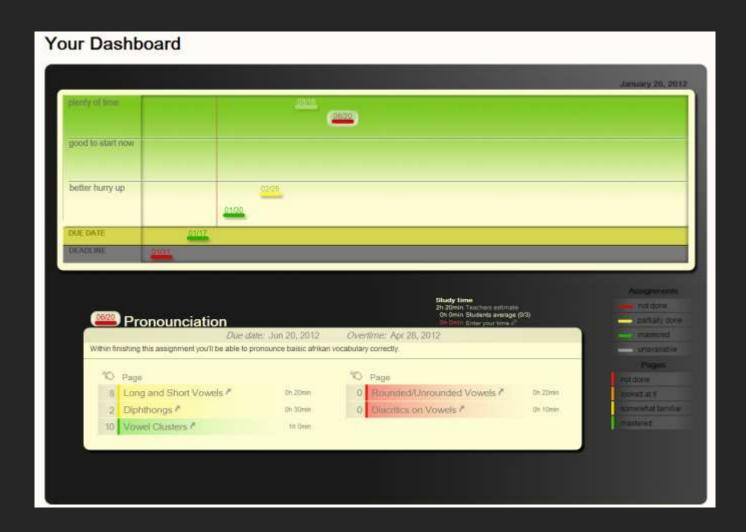

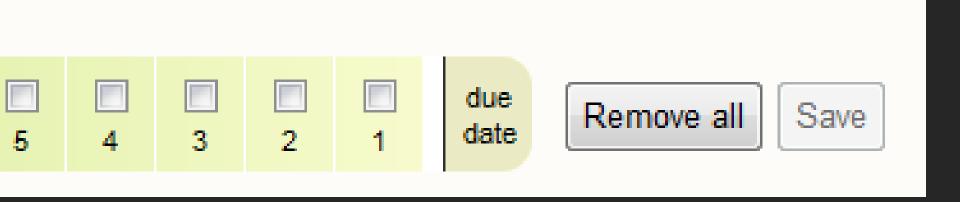
Self-tracking System

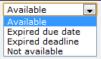
